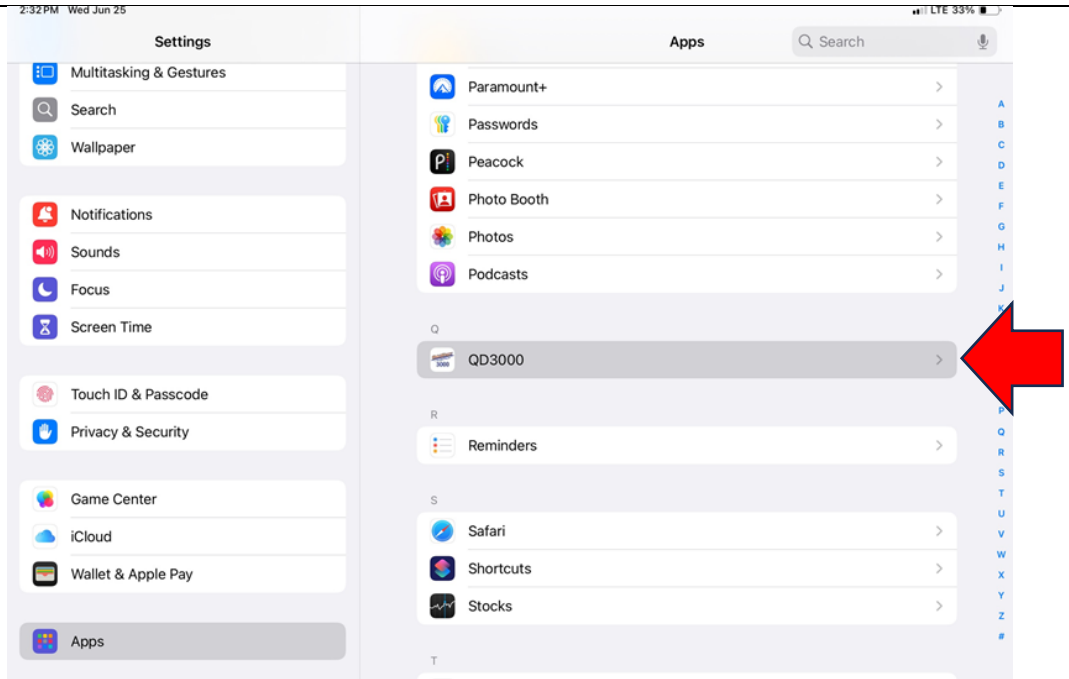
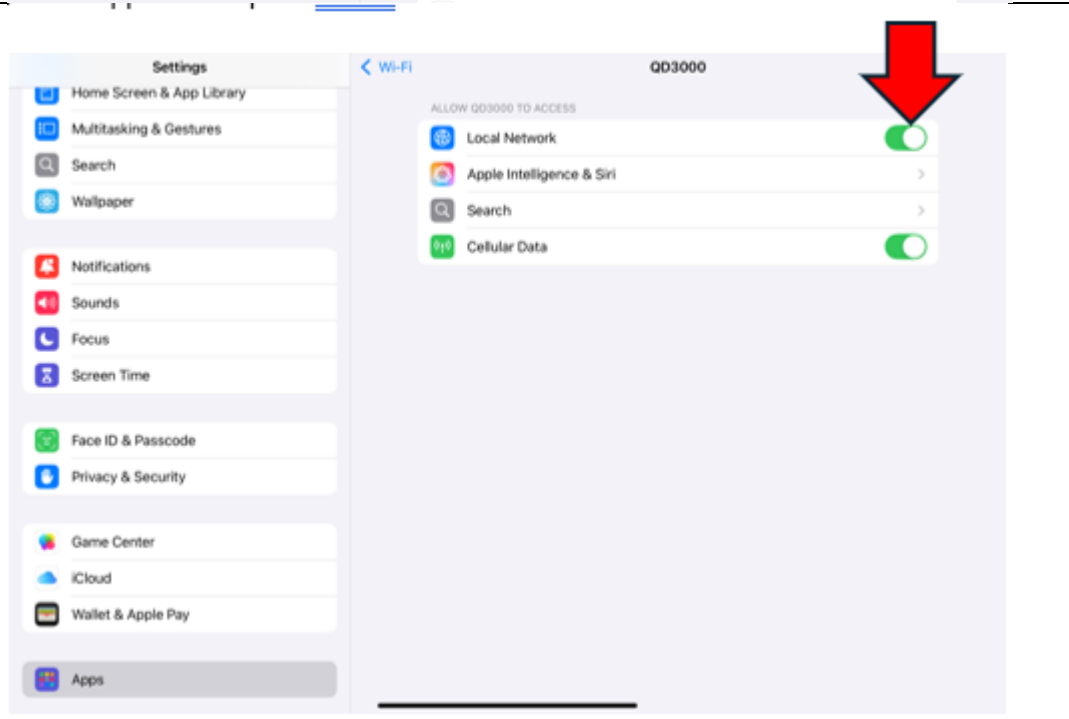

IPADs utilizing iPadOS Version 18.5 or newer must have the Local Network Enabled to allow the QD 3000 App to connect to the QuickDraw 3000 Controller. The steps to enable the Local Network setting are shown below:
